ABOUT

The Zoo Society generates support for the Point Defiance Zoo and Aquarium exhibits, education programs, scientific research, conservation activities, animal husbandry and care, capital projects and resources.

Funds for programs are generated through annual fund gifts, grants, individual donations, corporate sponsorships and fund raising events. Contributions can also be made to the Zoo Society Endowment Fund.

Point Defiance Zoo & Aquarium is the only combined zoo and aquarium in the Pacific Northwest. The 29-acre zoological park was established in 1905, and attracts about 700,000 visitors a year. It is nationally accredited by the Association of Zoos & Aquariums (AZA) and the Alliance of Marine Mammal Parks and Aquariums (AMMPA), which ensure rigorously high standards of animal welfare, veterinary care, conservation, education and more.

The Zoo sits within 700-acre Point Defiance Park, offering spectacular views of Mount Rainier, the Olympic Mountains and Puget Sound. PDZA is operated by Metro Parks Tacoma, the oldest independent park district in Washington.



AUTHORITY & REPORTING

Reporting to and working closely with the Board of Directors, the Executive Director supports the Zoo Society Board in implementing effective fundraising strategies, provides responsible stewardship of Society resources and donors, and inspires passion for the conservation mission of the Zoo. The ED is the chief spokesperson of the Society with ultimate responsibility for day to day management and administration, finance and operations, fundraising and event development within the guidelines established by the Board of Directors.

- An advanced degree or CFRE Certification is desired

- Five to ten years demonstrated success in leading major fundraising initiatives or comparable activities is required
- Use of technology and social media tools in fundraising is required

- Successful management of a significant fund development function, including use of all strategies and tactics in successful fundraising and donor development
- Experience with capital campaigns, public levy and/or bond issue campaigns is desired
- Leading/supporting a non-profit board in fundraising development and engagement
- Financial management; development and management of comparable operating budgets; familiarity with the audit process
- Managing a small organization; building, growth and/or transition of an organization and its programs
- Development and implementation of strategic plans and initiatives
- Work in zoos, aquariums, museums, parks or other similar facilities/organizations

- Relationship-building Builds constructive working relationships characterized by a high level of acceptance, cooperation and mutual regard; astute in cultivating and managing relationships toward a common goal; values the power of networks; strongly motivated by the chance to work with others, actively seeking out opportunities for teamwork and networking; politically and socially astute.
- Communications effectiveness Communicates with a wide vocabulary in a variety of settings to convey clear, persuasive messages that are effective in influencing the thoughts and actions of others; able to effectively present information and respond to questions both privately and to groups.
- Performance leadership Creates and nurtures a performance-based culture that develops and supports strategies to accomplish the organizational mission and fundraising goals; well-organized and focused; disciplined and intentional. Includes identifying traditional and non-traditional funding sources that can provide greatest impact to PDZA programs.
- Positively-focused Maintains a positive attitude; inspires optimism; enthusiastic, yet not afraid to express doubt on occasion.
- Adaptability to changing needs/flexibility Embraces changing business needs and adapts methods to achieve success in a dynamic and uncertain environment; comfortable in transitions.
